General education courses are interchangeable; students may choose the general education course(s) they wish to take in any given semester based on preference, availability, and academic goals.

Scheduling patterns vary for courses according to the semester they are taught.

- **Bold type** indicates courses requiring a quality grade of C or better.
- ***Bold Italics*** indicate courses requiring a quality grade of C or better and that satisfy both major and General Education requirements.
- GWS, GHA, GQ, GN, GA, GH, and GS are codes used to identify General Education requirements.
- US, IL are codes used to designate courses that satisfy University United States/International Cultures requirements.
- W is the code used to designate courses that satisfy University Writing Across the Curriculum requirement.

Scheduling patterns for courses not taught each semester:

Program Notes

- All students will take a Liberal Arts First-Year Seminar Course their first or second semester that will also count as general education.
- Students can double count US, IL and general education courses.
- Students are encouraged to complete their “Writing Across the Curriculum” requirement by choosing an appropriate 400-level economics writing course to fulfill the “Writing Across the Curriculum” requirement; if not, another “W” or “Y” course must be chosen within Liberal Arts.
- Students will have a variable number of required elective credits based on the credit value of individual course choices. Students **must** complete enough electives to graduate with **120 total credits**.
